Wetlands

In the video we learned about animals that live in a wetland habitat. A **Habitat** is the natural home of a plant or an animal. A **wetland** is a place in which the land is covered by water. In a wetland habitat, both plants and animals have lots of water around them. A wetland can be a pond, swamp, or lake. The animals in a wetland habitat can find the food and shelter that they need to survive.

Plants and animals all need special things to help them live and grow in their habitat:

- Plants need *sun, water, and soil* to help them grow.
- Animals need *food, water, and shelter* to help them live and grow.

Activity:

- With an adult, talk about different ways that your family gets food (shopping at the store, growing it in a garden, hunting). Where do you get your water from?

Writing prompt:

- Draw a picture of your habitat, or home. Include details that make your home special. Don't forget to draw the people that live in your home with you. Share your drawing with us on Teams.

Math:

- If there are 3 flamingos and 1 alligator that live in the wetland habitat, how many animals are there in all?
- There are 6 frogs in a pond and 2 of them hop away, how many frogs are left?
- Solve the problems with any strategy you want! Share your answers on Teams.
