The Zoo is always looking for donations of browse (fresh tree branches, shrubs, and leaves) to help encourage the natural feeding behaviors of species like elephants, rhinos, monkeys, and more. The browse program offers residents in the surrounding communities an impactful way to recycle their browse that would otherwise be thrown away.

The Zoo accepts the following varieties: xylosma, mulberry, Chinese pistache, carob, bamboo, Arundo grass, and Chinese elm. You can drop them off at the Zoo 24/7. Visit the Zoo's website fresnochaffeezoo.org to find the exact drop-off location and more information on their browse program.
