FRESNO CHAFFEE ZOO CELEBRATES SAFARI NIGHT

Fresno, CA – Safari Night, Fresno Chaffee Zoo's annual benefit was held on Friday, September 29th. With almost 700 guests in attendance, it was the most successful Safari Night yet.

"It was a spectacular night where we celebrated all the Zoo has accomplished and built excitement for the first phase of our master plan, the California experience, Sierras to the Sea," said Fresno Chaffee Zoo CEO and Director, Jon Forrest Dohlin. "We hope this experience will open visitors' hearts to the true beauty and iconic wildlife of our beautiful state."

Dohlin went on to announce that the Zoo aims to lead the effort to bring awareness to our state symbol, "Next year marks the 100th anniversary of the extinction of the California grizzly. Our team is currently planning to collaborate with accredited zoos and aquariums throughout the state to create public awareness through events, lectures, social media, and legislation with the hopes that this anniversary will honor something lost but also start the effort of finding ways for people and wildlife to thrive together."

The night also celebrated the Zoo's Centennial Campaign. This campaign celebrates the Zoo's 100 years of service to the Central Valley from 1929 to 2029. Chairing the Centennial Campaign is Kyle Kirkland, Fresno Chaffee Zoo Board Chair.

"I am honored to lead the effort to celebrate our centennial," said Kirkland. "As wonderful as Measure Z is, the Zoo's continued success will only happen through a combination of Measure Z resources, earned income, and private fundraising. We will need all three to ensure that the Zoo remains a renowned and respected destination for learning and wonderment and a leader in conservation efforts for future generations."
